1.1 FREE BREAST CANCER SCREENING CAMP

In view of birth anniversary of our Founder Chancellor Dr. D.G.S. Dhinakaran, the CEA – Rotaract Club in association with Thenmozhi Memorial Trust conducted a free “Breast Cancer Screening Camp” at Madvarayapuram Govt. School on 1st July 2018.

Club Coordinator Mr. L D Vijay Anand, Club Student President Rtr. Gideon M, Our District Rotaract Representative Rtr.PP. Shibin David, Mr. Arun Kumar Director – Thenmozhi Trust and Head of Centre for Extension Activities Dr. G. Manoj, were the core members in organizing this event. Sincere thanks to Mr. Arun Kumar (alumnus) who stood as a pillar of support to conduct this event by helping to bring the Mammography Equipment vehicle. Hearty thanks to Dr. Shanta Cancer Foundation, Trichy for their technical support and their valuable presence. Special thanks to the Department of Instrumentation engineering in helping to organize this event.

One of the most common malignancies in women nowadays is Breast Cancer. Breast Cancer is cancer that develops in breast tissue. There are more than 1 million cases per year in India. As the saying goes ‘Prevention is better than Cure’ it is better to be aware of the problem. It requires medical diagnosis, lab tests or imaging and is to be treated by medical professionals to avoid complications. There are 2 reasons why people die of any disease, firstly, Lack of awareness, people in our country need to be aware of the causes, effects and prevention of every disease. Secondly, inefficient facilities, few of the health centres do not have facilities which are up to the mark.

More than 100 individuals were given awareness about this disease. There were 50 plus successful screenings that happened during the camp. Few of the notable Rotarians from the region of Coimbatore were present. Directors of various avenues and many clubs from the Coimbatore region were present to highlight the gathering. With great hope we are taking a leap of faith believing this event is a grand success with a sole aim to help the people of our country.

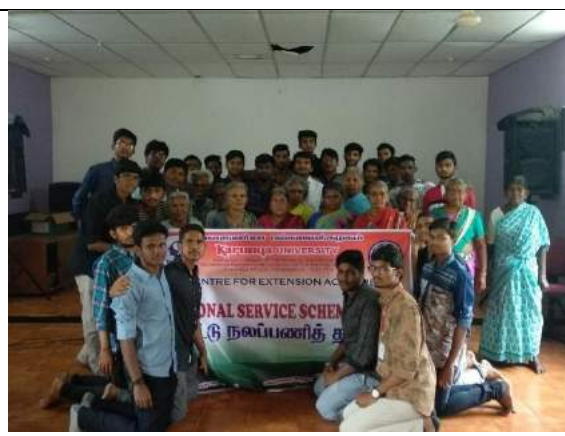

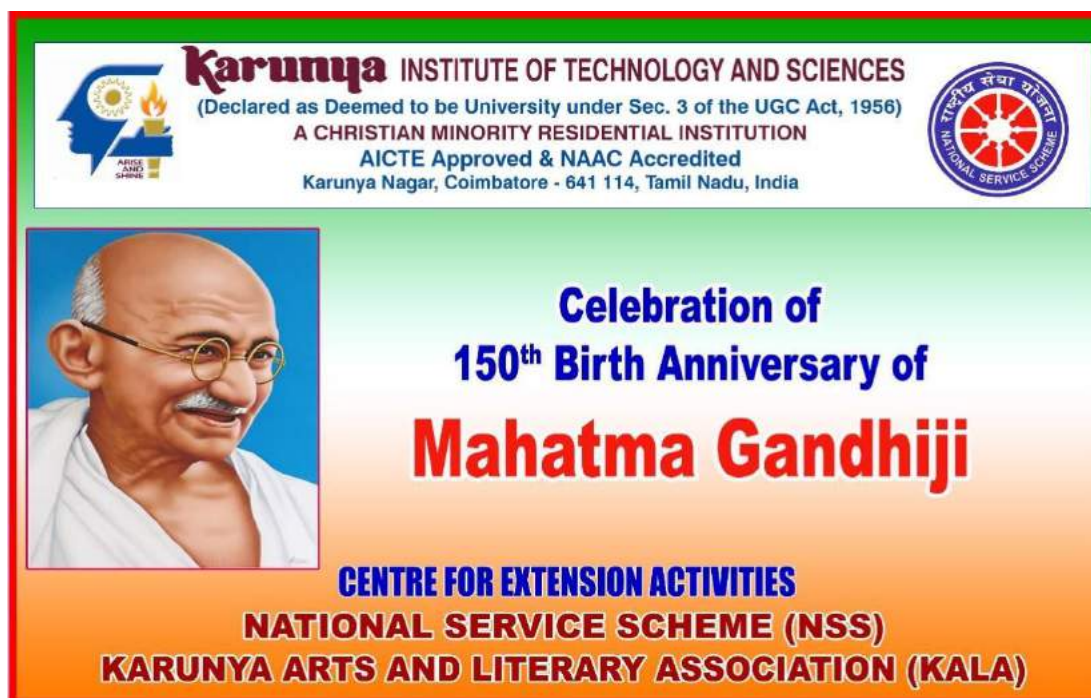

6.1 CYCLONE GAJA RELIEF CAMP

As per the advice given by the Chancellor of Karunya Deemed University and Founder of SEESHA, Dr. Paul Dhinakaran, Karunya University’s Centre for Extension Activities – NSS and SEESHA – (Non-governmental social service organization) sprung into ACTION. They came together and conducted a Relief & Medical camp in the Umathanadu village near Peravurani of

Tanjore District. The District of Tanjore was nearly razed by Cyclone Gaja last month. The relief materials, consisting of essentials like rice, dal, cooking oil, detergent, bath soap, coconut oil, water, tooth brushes, toothpaste, Mosquito coil, candles, warm bedsheets and towels were distributed to more than 500 families who were victimized by the cyclone. The net worth of the materials was estimated to be more than 5 lacs.

A team consisting of 17 NSS Student Volunteers and 9 staff from Karunya and 3 Doctors and 3 assistants from SEESHA began their journey along with the relief materials on 5th December 2018 at around 10 p.m.

Dr. P. Mannar Jawahar, Vice Chancellor encouraged the team members and flagged off the Camp on 5th December 2018. Dr. E.J. James, Pro Vice Chancellor and Dr. Elijah Blessing and Deans were also present.

They reached Peravurani at 6.00 a.m. the following day. After some refreshments and a quick breakfast they travelled to the village Umathanadu and reached at 8.30 a.m. The people of the village were then made to gather at 9.00 a.m. in the common area where Dr. Samuel Thomas, the Chief Doctor of SEESHA Hospital, then began to acquaint them with the activities of SEESHA and the various ministries of the Founding Family. Dr. G. Manoj and Dr. K. Karthikeyan, proceeded to then explain the purpose of the relief camp. Following the explanation, the relief materials were then distributed to people along with the assistance of the local village leaders. At around 11.30 a.m., the team moved to the Govt. Middle School in the village. SEESHA's Medical team conducted a 'Free Medical Camp' for the village people. Their 'Free of cost' policy not only covered the costs of the common medical tests that were conducted but also the medicines distributed to around 300 people. The camp concluded with a nutritious lunch provided by the team, for approximately 1000 people.

The team then began their return trip back to Karunya's campus and reached at 3.00 a.m. on the 7th of December 2018.

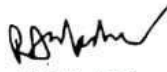


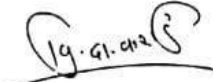
